Health and Sustainability in Seaside: Workshop Overview

Throughout the community engagement process for Seaside 2040, community members have continually expressed their desire to have a high quality of life for all residents, preserve the natural environment, expand economic opportunities, improve public health and safety, provide safe and affordable housing for all residents, and preserve the natural environment. To a large degree, Seaside residents are expressing their vision for a healthy and sustainable Seaside for existing and future residents.

The design of our communities has a great impact on our health and the well-being of our residents. While the goals of health and sustainability are interwoven across various chapters of the General Plan, our goal here is to ensure future planning efforts consider 10 important characteristics of a healthy and sustainable community:


1. Build for people, not cars
2. Provide opportunity for recreation and interaction
3. Make healthy food accessible
4. Provide good access to needed resources and services
5. Provide safe, healthy, and affordable housing
6. Create clean environments
7. Directly address inequities and economic disparities
8. Prepare for the impacts of climate change
9. Conservation of natural resources
10. Protection of open space and habitat

Seaside's community must protect the assets that make it a great place to live, work, and recreate. From global climate change to economic transformation, the City has the opportunity to make choices that will positively impact the community, environment, and economy and make it more healthy, sustainable, and resilient to future change.

Environmental Sustainability

DESCRIPTION

Environmental sustainability is often defined as the ability to meet the needs of the current generation without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs. As shown in the graphic below, environmental sustainability covers a wide range of topics, including energy and water conservation, diverting waste from the landfill, preparing for the potential impacts of climate change, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, habitat preservation and biological diversity. Taken together, the City can improve the quality of life for its residents and contribute to a healthier and more vibrant world for future generations.



Community Health

DESCRIPTION

A community's overall health depends on many factors. Eating well, staying active, and seeing a doctor can all have positive impacts on health. Community health, however, is also influenced by access to social and economic opportunities, the quality of education, neighborhood conditions, workplace safety, and the cleanliness of water, air, and soil, among others. These conditions influence why some people are healthier than others, and why the places people live and work also matter to community health. The figure below shows examples of key healthy community components.



Healthy community design bridges together planning activities (including land use, transportation, and infrastructure) to establish a strong tie with health related items, including but not limited to physical activity, safety, and healthy food access. Healthy community programs can also bring many benefits to Seaside, from better health to new jobs to economic investments. Improving these determinants can also help promote equity and community development over the long term and prepare the City for the potential impacts of climate change.

Economic Development

DESCRIPTION

Economic development is a critical component of a community's well-being and prosperity, and foundational in setting strategies to meet a broad range of objectives, including business growth and investment, job creation and retention, supporting a diversity of employment opportunities, and fiscal stability. The Seaside General Plan addresses a range of topics designed to improve jobs, diversity of non-residential uses and the overall fiscal health of the community. Economic development impacts touch many other topics of the General Plan, including land use, transportation, levels of public services, and education. It is also a key component of creating a healthy and sustainable community.

Seaside is in a unique economic position, largely due to its setting along Monterey Bay, and access to resources, such as the Fort Ord National Monument, California State University Monterey Bay, Monterey College of Law, and the City's commercial corridors, such as Fremont Boulevard and Broadway Avenue. By capitalizing on these resources, Seaside is positioned to strengthen and expand existing business clusters and attract new industries and businesses that will provide more diverse, long-term revenues, and expand a diversity of employment opportunities, from entry level to head-of-household.

Utilize Seaside’s labor force as an economic development resource.

1. Promote job training/placement in industries responsive to future trends and City goals, such as “green” industries focused on environmental sustainability and renewable energy.
2. Align economic development efforts with the labor pool to increase the number of jobs filled by Seaside residents, from entry level to head-of-household jobs.
3. Maintain strong relationships with CSUMB and Monterey College of Law to collaborate on potential expansion, and retain students, employees and instructors as permanent Seaside residents.

From building innovative spaces for arts and culture to supporting diverse programming, the City plays an important role in providing opportunities to cultivate and foster an appreciation for arts and culture and enrich the lives of residents of all ages. The integration of arts and culture into City spaces also provides an important opportunity to support the creative community and to build a reputation as a regional center for arts and culture.

Affordable Housing

DESCRIPTION

When housing becomes scarce and unaffordable, it tends to create instability in a community, with people seeking affordable housing opportunities elsewhere to start a career, raise a family, or settle in for retirement. A sustainable community should offer a range of housing options to accommodate the diverse and changing needs of its current and future residents. A sufficient supply of various types of housing helps moderate prices and allows for mobility within the housing market when a household's housing needs evolves over time. The provision of affordable housing should also consider high quality housing, as well as access to services, employment, and other amenities (e.g., shopping, recreation, and entertainment).
